

Entry Qualifications for International Undergraduate Admissions

General Notes

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- You **SHOULD** provide one of the eligible admission qualifications with your application.
 - If you don't have one of the eligible test scores or diplomas, you will not be offered admission.
 - If you have one of the eligible test scores or diplomas, but with scores below our minimum criteria, you will not be offered admission.
 - You can apply with your predicted scores issued by your school.
 - There is no time limitation on eligible diploma grades.
 - We strongly recommend that you apply as early as possible if you have **ALL** your documents ready.
 - The admission criteria published in the table must be used as a guide and therefore meeting them will not automatically guarantee an offer. Admission evaluation is subject to meeting all admission criteria including English proficiency requirements.
 - The weight given to each admission criterion will vary across applicants with respect to individual backgrounds and merits.
 - Applicants may be asked to provide additional qualifications and documents or sit for interviews, if needed.
