1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this guideline is to regulate the principles for the execution of minor programs that will be opened in order to ensure that students who successfully enroll in their major undergraduate programs are registered with a limited number of courses within the same higher education institution to receive a certificate (minor certificate) that does not replace a diploma.

2. SCOPE

This regulation covers all undergraduate-level students registered to Koç University, as well as the units and the individuals responsible for performing the procedures.

4. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- **4.1** The President is responsible for the execution of this regulation.
- **4.2** The Vice President for Academic Affairs is responsible for the preparation and the revision of this regulation.

4.3 Students are responsible for keeping themselves informed of the procedures and are expected to follow all rules covered by the regulation.

- **4.4** College Deans are responsible for the application of the regulation.
- **4.5** The Registrar's and Student Affairs Directorate is responsible for ensuring that conditions for application to, attendance to and completion of the program are met.

6.BASIC PRINCIPLES

Within the content of the minor program, it is compulsory to take the courses determined by the senate decision and to succeed these courses. These courses are decided among the relevant departments and submitted to the approval of the relevant faculty committees and the university senate.

7.METHODS

7.1 Conditions for application and admittance into the Minor Program

7.1.1 Students can apply to the minor programs at the beginning of the first academic semester of the second year and at the beginning of the second academic semester of the third year at the latest, considering the number of credits they have completed in the major program.

7.1.2 Students who want to start the minor program can start in the period when they apply for the minor program provided that they have the success requirements by examining the last semester courses they have completed.

7.1.3 Students whose GPA is at least 2.50 over 4.00 can apply to the minor program.

7.1.4 Students who have successfully completed all credit courses in the undergraduate program until the semester they apply for, can apply to the minor program. With the notable exception of UNIV 101, ALIS 100, CPAP 100 / DOS 171, CPAP 150 and HIST 100 courses, receiving "unsatisfactory" grades from 1-credit courses shall not constitute an obstacle to application to the minor programs.

7.1.5 A student cannot register for more than one minor program at the same time.

7.2 Standing and Program Completion Conditions

7.2.1 In order to qualify for the minor, the average of the courses taken by the student within the minor program must be at least 2.29 / 4.00.

7.2.2 Minor certificate does not replace diploma.

7.3 Leaving the Minor Program, Dismissal

7.3.1 Students can leave the minor program at their own request.

7.3.2 Students enrolled in the minor program can start another minor program provided that they provide the starting time and success conditions specified in Article 7.1.

7.3.3 To continue the minor program, the GPA of the students must be at least 2.29 in the major program.

7.3.4 Students leaving or dismissing from minor programs do not have to repeat the minor program courses they have failed.

- 7.3.5 The success in the minor program does not affect the graduation from the major program.
- **7.3.6** Students who are considered to be on leave from the major program, are deemed to be on leave from the minor program without requiring an additional decision.
- **7.3.7** Students who have completed their major requirements but failed to complete the minor program are given an additional two-semester period to meet the requirements for graduation, depending on the decision of the board of directors. Scholarship rights of the students with this scholarship do not continue.
- **7.3.8** Students who have the right to graduate from the major program but cannot complete the minor program are given an additional period of maximum two semesters upon the decision of the relevant board of directors.
- **7.3.9** Students who do not take courses from the minor program for two consecutive semesters are deregistered this program.

7.4 Other Terms

7.4.1 With the decision of the Academic Council, new conditions may be introduced in addition to those specified in this guideline regarding the minor programs, and the predicted minimum success criteria can be changed.

7.4.2 "Koç University Undergraduate Education Regulation" is valid for the subjects that are not included in this guideline.

7.4.3 Our all students are responsible for following the current version of this guideline, which will be published on KU Registrar's office web pages.



8.RECORDS

The relevant application forms are archived by the Registrar's Office.

9.REVISIONS

The responsibility of revising and updating this regulation falls on the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs. The revision is performed every April on a yearly basis.
