

Graduation rankings honors determination principles were discussed and the following items were accepted:

- a) In order to be included in the graduation rankings and be entitled to receive graduation honor degrees, it was unanimously accepted that students complete the course load of at least 75 credits with a passing grade at Koç University.
- b) From the end of the Spring 2024, the relevant department's undergraduate students who will be ranked in the graduation process must be major students in that department.
- c) Grades for courses that were transferred to Koç University from another institution, or which was obtained through a student exchange program, or who were taken in a Summer Semester course(s) at another university are also included in the graduation ranking calculation as long as these courses count towards student's graduation.
- d) Courses whose credits are transferred and letter grades are not transferred do not affect the GPA, but are included in the GPA to be used for graduation ranking.
- e) The GPA used for graduation rankings is calculated on the basis of the average of the grades obtained before the S conversion and S/U grades.
- f) For students whose graduation from double majors is postponed until the year following graduation from the major program.
 - A student can enter the school ranking only once.
 - A student can enter a College's ranking only once. (For example; a student who ranked 2nd in his/her major in CE in 2020 will not be listed as 1st in the CE College rankings again if his/her double major is engineering in 2021; but if his/her double major is in CASE, he/she may enter the CASE College rankings in 2021.)
- g) Students who have received an academic disciplinary penalty or a disciplinary penalty resulting in suspension or upper penalty and who have received (academic or non-academic) disciplinary penalty cannot be included in the graduation ranking and cannot receive an honorary degree.
- h) The University reserves the right to change the graduation ranking calculation criteria.
- i) Graduation honor degrees will be awarded as a result of GPAs calculated according to these principles:
 - Cum Laude - Honor for students with a GPA between 3.25-3.49,
 - Magna Cum Laude – High Honor for students with a GPA between 3.50-3.74,
 - Students with a GPA of 3.75 and above will be awarded Summa Cum Laude – Highest Honor degrees.

The criteria for the Dean's Honor Roll announced at the end of each semester and the Vehbi Koç Honor Awards announced every year after the Spring semester are as follows:

Dean's Honor Roll: Effective with Fall 2021 Semester, students with a GPA of 3.25 and above at the end of each semester and who have completed that semester with at least 15 credits from 'graded courses' are included in the "Dean's Honor Roll". The honor roll is announced by the deans of the programs they are enrolled in. Students who have received a disciplinary penalty resulting in suspension or who have received more than one (academic or administrative) disciplinary penalty cannot be included in the Dean's Honor Roll.

Medicine students' eligibility for Vehbi Koç Honor Awards or Dean Honors Roll is determined according to Koç University School of Medicine Undergraduate Procedures.

Vehbi Koç Honor Awards: Effective with Fall 2021 Semester, the Vehbi Koç Honor Award is given, at the end of the Spring semester each year, to students who have a GPA of 3.75 and above and have received at least 15 credits from the 'graded courses', in the last Fall or Spring semesters. Students who have received a disciplinary penalty resulting in suspension or who have received more than one (academic or administrative) disciplinary penalty cannot receive the Vehbi Koç Honor Award.
